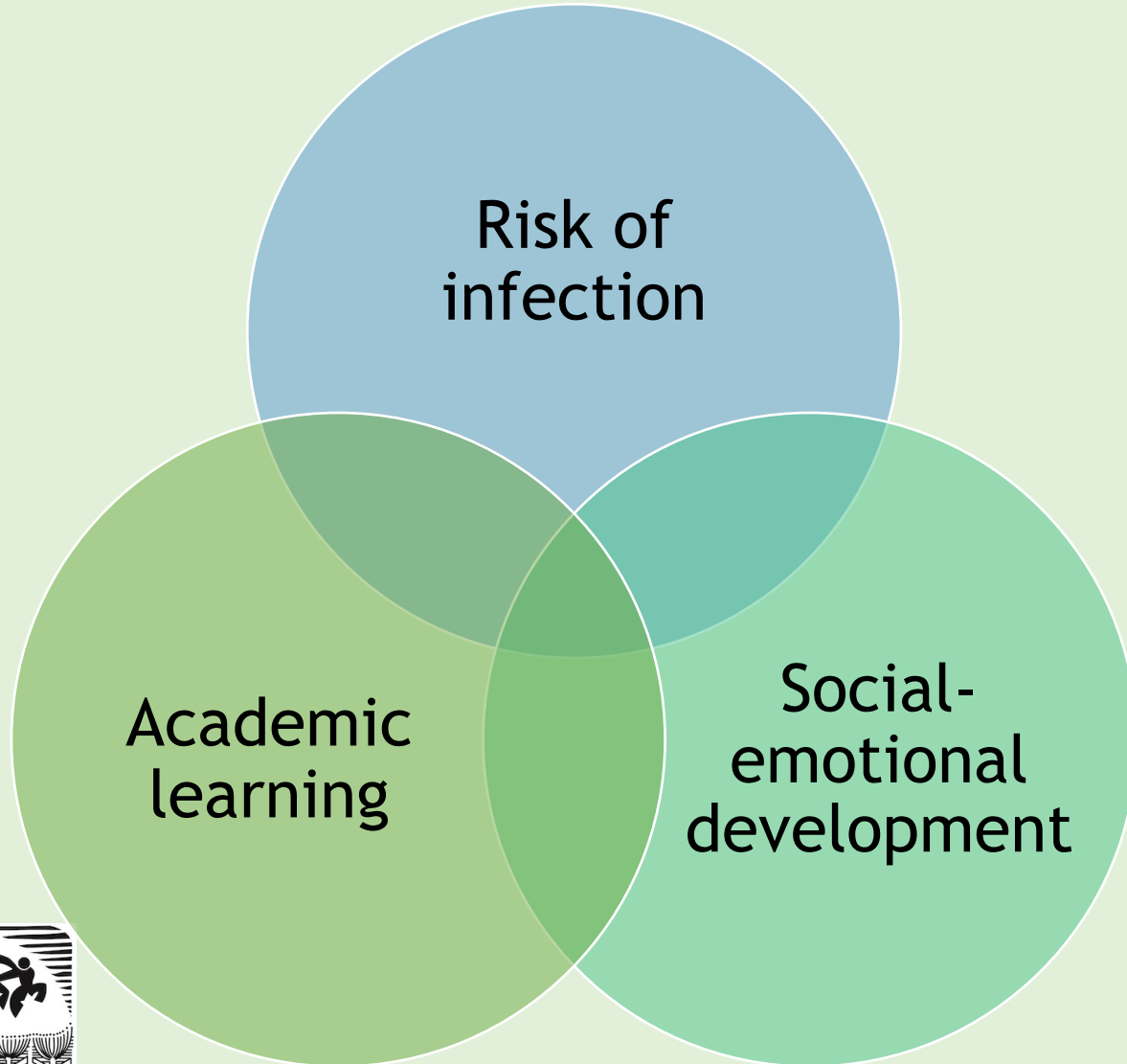

# Cleaning & Sanitation

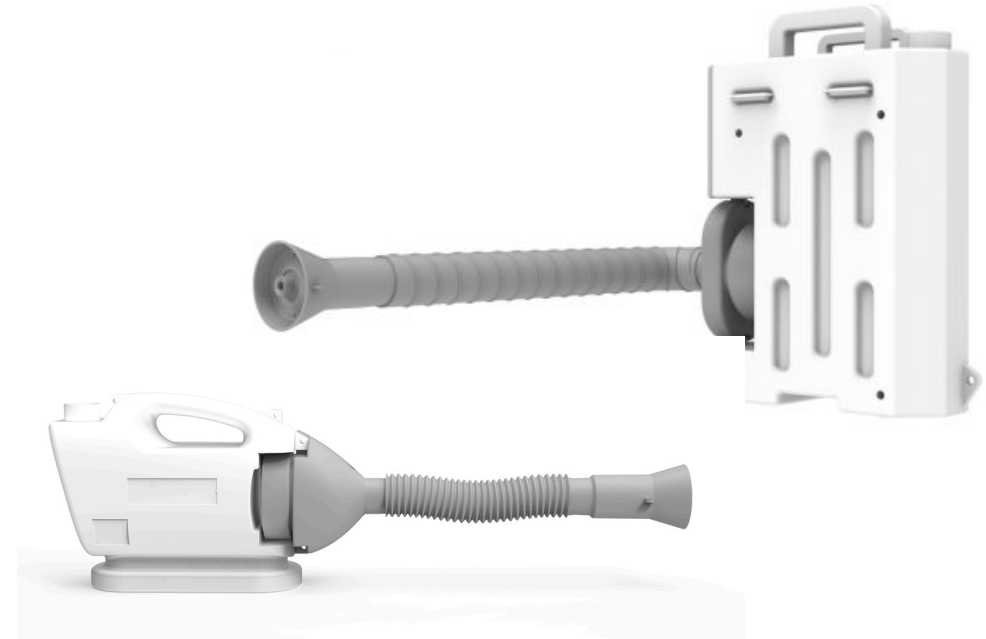
All tables and high touch surfaces disinfected daily

Reduce use of shared space and materials

Shared spaces and materials:

- Additional cleanings and disinfection at critical times (e.g. bathrooms)
- Protocols for all students and adult to disinfect before and after each use. Build into the culture and routines.

*Accepting donations of wipes, hand sanitizer, masks, and soap.*

# ‘Ohana Bubble

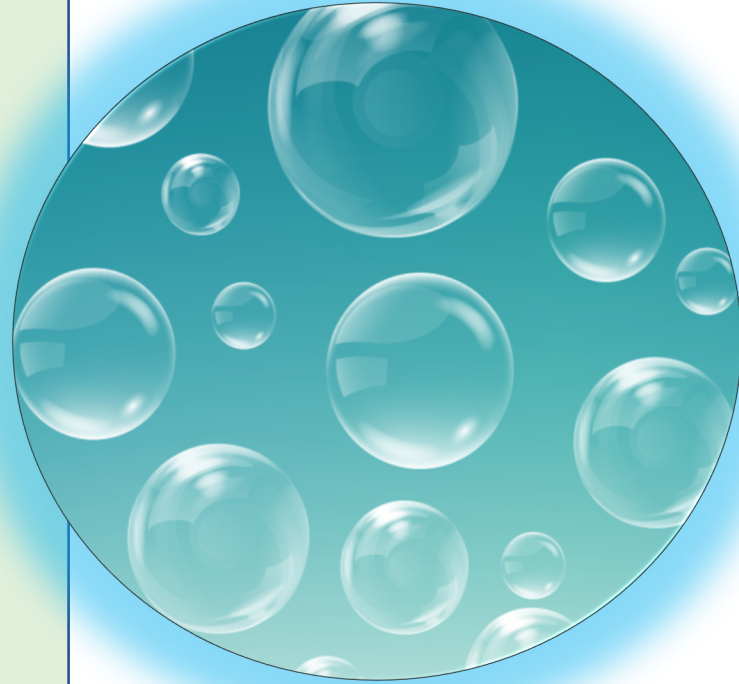
Same students, same room

6' social distancing

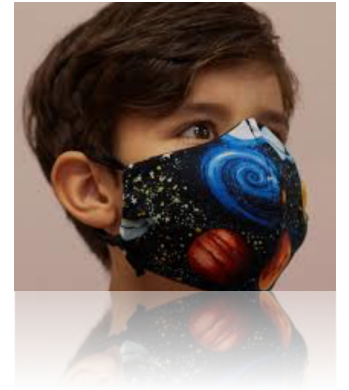
Cap occupancy according to room configuration

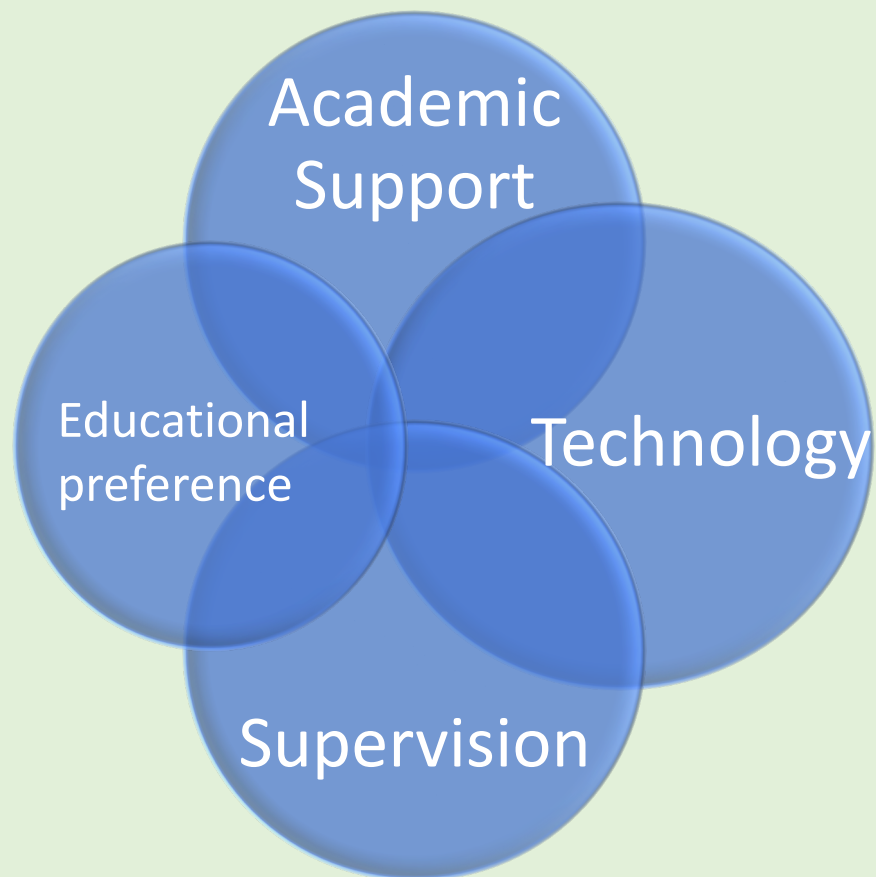
